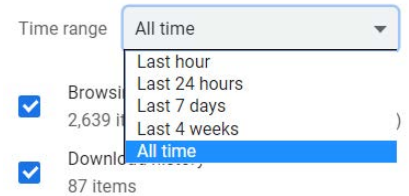

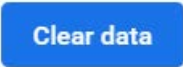


Google Chrome

- Click **Clear Browsing Data**

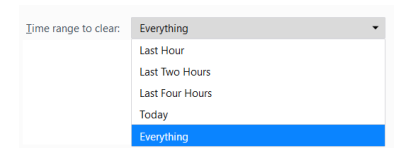

- Click **Options**

- Click the **Delete** button under Browsing History section



From the dropdown menu next to '**Clear the following items from**' select '**the beginning of time**'




Microsoft Edge
